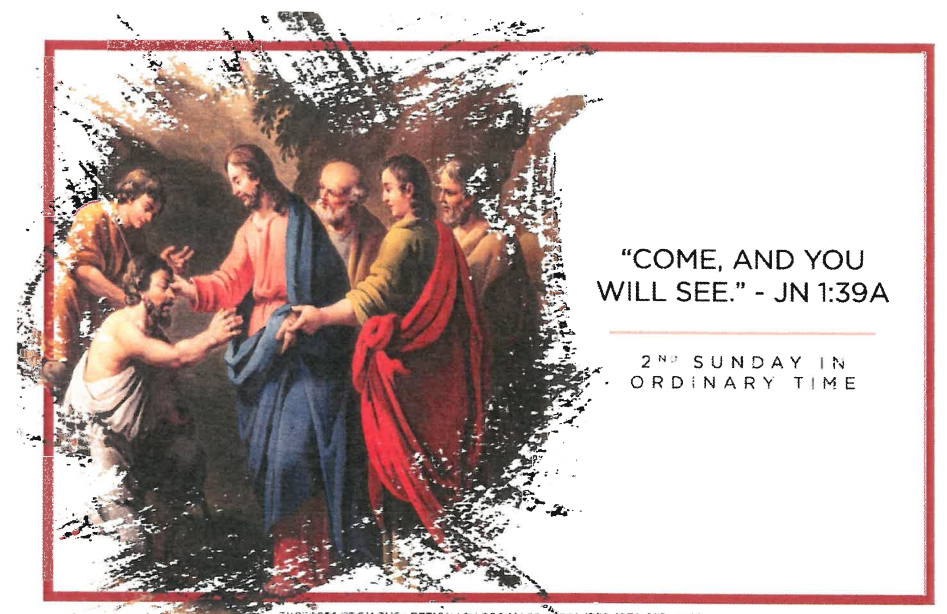

First Reading I Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19

Paul uses ordinary events to try to explain the Christian message to the Corinthians. Here, he uses sexual union to explain the union between God and the believer. This union in the Holy Spirit should guide and determine everything we do.

Gospel John 1: 35-42
In Year B, most of the gospel readings are taken from Mark, but the Second Sunday in each cycle reads from John—either John the Baptist's witness to Jesus or, in Year C, the account of the wedding at Cana. In today's text, John gives witness to Jesus as the "Lamb of God." The disciples who come to know Jesus then spread the word about him, and that attracts Simon, whom Jesus nicknames "Peter".
